Team List: Victim Injuries—Tenderfoot

[No Tenderfoot Scouts were along on this trip.]

Team List: Victim Injuries—1st Class

Your victim needs first aid for:

- Severely sprained left ankle (he can't walk).
- Right-side collarbone injury.
- Might be having a heart attack.
- Is dehydrated.

Carry the victim back to the starting point. The ankle sprain is severe; he can not walk.

Team List: Victim Injuries—2nd Class

Your victim needs first aid for:

- Serious bleeding from his right hand.
- A barbless fish hook is stuck in his left hand.
- Is showing signs of the early stages of hypothermia.
- Is in shock

Your victim can walk a little, but is disoriented and stumbling, so needs help.

Team List: Victim Injuries—Older Scouts

Your victim needs first aid for:

- Broken left lower leg.
- Is disoriented.
- Has frostbite on his fingers and ears.
- Seems to be choking.

Adult Checklist: Victim Injuries—2nd Class

Be sure Scouts:

- Call/go for help.
- Calm him down.
- Remove fish hook.
- Use antibacterial ointment and a band-aid on the fish hook wound in the *left* hand.
- Stop serious bleeding by raising the *right* hand and using a pressure point.
- Get him warm with a blanket, extra coat, hot chocolate, etc.
- Have him lay down, elevate feet and head, give him a drink.

Help the victim back to the starting point.

Adult Checklist: Victim Injuries—1st Class

Be sure Scouts:

- Call/go for help.
- Calm him down.
- Fix *left* ankle. Be sure wrapping is tight and immobilizes ankle.
- Fix right-side collarbone injury. Be sure wrapping is tight.
- Describe signs of a heart attack.
- Treat for shock: have the victim lie down, elevate legs and head, and keep warm.
- Treat for dehydration: get the victim out of the sun, give *sips* of water.

Carry the victim back to the starting point. The ankle sprain is severe; he can not walk. The victim can walk a bit, but is disoriented and stumbling, so he needs help.

Adult Checklist: Victim Injuries—Older Scouts

Be sure Scouts:

- First: treat for choking. Ask the victim, "are you choking?" (Yes.) Can they breathe? (No.) Show motion of giving the Heimlich maneuver.
- Call/go for help.
- Calm him down.
- Splint the leg; be sure the leg is immobilized.
- Treat for shock: have the victim lie down, elevate legs and head, and keep warm.
- Treat frostbite: cover the ears to keep warm; put hands over them to warm.
 Warm fingers by putting them in armpits, etc; keep warm with gloves.

Carry the victim back to the starting point. He can't walk and is disoriented; he should be carried on a stretcher.
